



COMMUNITY FORESTS IN THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO

STRENGTHENING FOREST COMMUNITIES' RIGHTS AND ENABLING THEM TO MANAGE THEIR TRADITIONAL LANDS IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE MEANS OF BOTH PROTECTING RAINFORESTS AND FIGHTING POVERTY.

IN 2014, THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO (DRC) PASSED COMMUNITY FOREST LEGISLATION IN WHAT IS ARGUABLY THE MOST GROUND-BREAKING LEGAL DEVELOPMENT RELATED TO CONGO BASIN RAINFORESTS IN RECENT YEARS.

was adopted by the government in 2018 sustaining the vision of learning by doing, a gradual approach, based on community rights and traditional management practices

LOOKING FORWARD

- **Supporting the National Community Forests Strategy** experimental phase and pave the way for national scaling-up of community forests in 2023
- **Continuing to develop and test** the legal and policy framework
- **Providing continued training and tools** to DRC government at national and local levels
- **Maintaining and strengthening** civil society monitoring and advocacy
- **Supporting more communities** to obtain their community forests
- **Preparing for the management phase:**
 - **Strengthening community governance** to ensure equity and inclusion
 - **Testing models to improve livelihoods** and attract private investment into community forests
 - **Designing management plans** that prevent deforestation and protect biodiversity
