



CONTEXT

RFUK's work in **Peru** began in the 1990s supporting the titling of Indigenous Ashaninka lands in the Ene River valley.

ForestLink was set up in 2015 to capture and transmit geo-referenced reports on forestry concessions and has been successfully used in Madre de Dios since 2016.

RFUK partners with local **Indigenous organisations** to promote **sustainable forest management**.
